

Clear Creek ISD 2001-2002 Student Dress Code

Elementary Schools | Secondary Schools | Creekside Intermediate | League City Intermediate | Seabrook Intermediate | Webster Intermediate | Clear View Alternative | Brookside Intermediate | Clear Lake City Elementary

(Several Clear Creek ISD schools have adopted standardized dress codes. Please contact your child's school to verify if there is a standardized dress code and to obtain a list of the dress code guidelines.)

The Dress Code is included in the student handbooks which all students receive at the beginning of the school year. However, to assist in purchasing the wardrobe for the school year, below is an online copy of the 2000-2001 Dress Code.

* Dress code applies to all Clear Creek ISD schools except Creekside Intermediate School, League City Intermediate School, Seabrook Intermediate School, Webster Intermediate School, Clear View Alternative School, Brookside Intermediate School and Clear Lake City Elementary School that have adopted standardized dress codes as indicated below.

Clear Creek ISD 2000-2001 Elementary School Dress Code*

(For schools that have not adopted a standardized dress code)

The Clear Creek ISD Dress Code is established to teach grooming, hygiene, instill discipline and modesty, prevent disruption, avoid safety hazards, teach respect for authority, and prepare our students for the future. Accordingly, the following standards shall apply:

- Appropriate clothing and shoes are required.
- Inappropriate clothing includes, but is not limited to, cut-offs, short shorts or gym shorts, halters, strapless garments, tank tops, and clothes that expose the midriff.
- Any garment, regardless of what it is called, must be worn no shorter than mid-thigh.
- Skirts and dresses must come to at least mid-thigh when the student is seated.
- Pants or shorts shall be appropriately sized and worn at the natural waistline, belted if necessary.
- Clothes, jewelry, and other accessories that contain suggestive or vulgar slogans or advertise illegal products, including alcohol and tobacco, are not allowed.
- Spiked, leather accessories and wallet chains are not allowed.
- Hats and caps may not be worn in the building.
- No visible body piercing other than a student's ears will be allowed. (Example: No tongue piercing)
- Clothing/hair styles that in the judgement of the building administrators pose a health or safety hazard and/or disrupt the educational process are not allowed. Students are prohibited from attending school with hair dyed an unnatural color.

Failure to comply will result in the student's being required to change clothes. All class time missed is considered an unexcused absence. The building administrators determine whether a student's dress is appropriate. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action. Appropriate discipline procedures shall be followed in all cases.

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Clear Creek ISD 2000-2001 Secondary School Dress Code*

(For schools that have not adopted a standardized dress code)

The Clear Creek ISD Dress Code is established to teach grooming, hygiene, instill discipline and modesty, prevent disruption, avoid safety hazards, teach respect for authority, and prepare our students for the future. Accordingly, the following standards shall apply:

- Appropriate clothing and shoes in good repair are required.
- Inappropriate clothing includes, but is not limited to, cut-offs, short shorts or gym shorts, halters, strapless garments, tank tops, and clothes that expose the midriff or under the arm.
- Any garment, regardless of what it is called, must be worn no shorter than mid-thigh.
- Skirts and dresses must come to at least mid-thigh when the student is seated.
- Pants or shorts shall be appropriately sized and worn at the natural waistline.
- Campuses may insist that shirts and blouses must be tucked in at all times.
- Clothes, jewelry, and other accessories that contain suggestive or vulgar slogans or advertise illegal products, including alcohol and tobacco, are not allowed.
- Spiked, leather accessories and wallet chains are not allowed.
- Hats, caps, and sunglasses may not be worn in the building.
- No visible body piercing other than a student's ears will be allowed. (Example: No tongue piercing.)
- Clothing/hair styles that in the judgment of the building administrators pose a health or safety hazard and/or disrupt the educational process are not allowed. Students are prohibited from attending school with hair dyed an unnatural color.

Failure to comply will result in the student's being required to change clothes. All class time missed is considered an unexcused absence. Campuses may establish additional restrictions on student dress as needed at that school. The building administrators determine whether a student's dress is appropriate. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action. Appropriate discipline procedures shall be followed in all cases. Campuses may insist that all bags, backpacks, gym bags, etc., should remain in a student's locker throughout the school day.

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Clear Creek ISD 2000-2001 Standardized Dress Codes

Following are summaries of the standardized dress codes for Creekside Intermediate School, League City Intermediate School, Seabrook Intermediate School, Webster Intermediate School, Clear View Alternative School, Brookside Intermediate School and Clear Lake City Elementary School. Creekside Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

White, gray, black, light blue, royal blue, or navy blue

Bottom

Khaki, navy blue, or black (no black pants and black top)

- No labels or logos may be displayed.
- Long or short sleeved knit polo or golf shirts with collar.
- Shirts must be a solid color and tucked in so belt is visible.
- A solid white, short-sleeve t-shirt may be worn underneath.
- Sweatshirts must be a solid color, pullover, have banded wrists and waist, crew (rounded) neck, and may not have a hood or a pouch. (Collared shirt underneath required.)
- Any Creekside Intermediate School Spirit shirt.
- Coats, light jackets, blazers, vests, and sweaters may be worn to school, but must be placed in lockers during school.

Shoes

Comfortable for walking and general exercise.

- Must include a back strap over the heel.
- Heels may not be higher than 2".

Socks

Solid color w/no logos or insignia. Must match dress code colors and both be same color.

- If logo is present, it must measure a square inch or less.
- Slacks (docker/tailored style only), shorts, skirts, skorts, overalls, or jumpers in solid colors.
- No denim or spandex fabric of any color.
- Waist of pants must be within 1" of the measured waist.
- No oversized pockets in front or rear.
- No extra pockets on the leg (no "cargo" style).
- Brown or black belt required if belt loops are present. Belt should not extend more than 6" from buckle.
- Crotch of pants must fit at the natural crotch of the student.
- No baggy pants (side seam measured at 4" from thigh or less). May not sag away from the body.
- Bottom of hem must be within 6" of the ground when kneeling for shorts, skirts, jumpers, overalls or skorts (measured from top of slit on a skirt).

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League City Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

White, gray, maroon, hunter green (dark), light blue, royal blue, or navy blue

- No labels or logos may be displayed.
- Long or short sleeved polo, golf, turtleneck, mock turtleneck, or dress shirts with collar. Must be tucked in.
- Shirts must be a solid color (no stripes).
- A solid white, short-sleeve t-shirt may be worn underneath. Shirts should remain buttoned over t-shirt.
- Sweatshirts must be a solid color, have banded wrists and waist, crew (rounded) neck, no zipper, and may not have a hood or a pouch. (Collared shirt underneath required.)
- Any League City Intermediate School Spirit shirt (Fridays only).
- Coats, windbreaker, vests (0 to 2 pockets/no sleeves), and sweaters (pullover, no zipper, and solid colors) are allowed. (Cannot be tied to waist or too large.)
- Heavy coats must be placed in lockers

Bottom

Khaki, navy blue, gray, olive green, or black

- Slacks, shorts, skirts, skorts, or jumpers in solid colors. No logo or label displayed.
- No denim, vinyl, leather, nylon, or spandex.
- Waist of pants must be within 1" of the measured waist.
- No oversized pockets in front or rear.
- No extra pockets on the leg (no "cargo" style).
- Belt required and seen if belt loops are present. Belt should not extend more than 6" from buckle.
- Crotch of pants must fit at the natural crotch of the student.
- No baggy pants (side seam measured at 4" from thigh or less). May not sag away from the body nor cling tightly to the body.

Shoes

Comfortable for walking and general exercise

- Must include a back strap over the heel.
- Heels may not be higher than 2".

Socks

Solid color w/no logos or insignia. Must match dress code colors and both be same color.

- Pants must be hemmed and may not touch the ground.
- Bottom of skirt hem must be within 6" of the ground when kneeling (measured from top of slit on a skirt)

Jewelry

No inappropriate collars or wrist bands (spiked or leather). No choker more than 1/2" wide. Pierced jewelry limited to ears only.

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Seabrook Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

Gray, maroon, navy, light blue, yellow, or white.

- Long or short sleeved dress or polo shirt with collar. Must be solid color without labels or logos, except for a school sponsored logo. No turtlenecks or mock turtlenecks are to be worn underneath shirt. Undershirt should be white t-shirts or v-necked t-shirts & not seen.
- Sweatshirts, coats, light jackets, blazers, vests, sweaters, or sweater vests must be solid colored (see above colors) and may not display a label or logo of any kind.
- A shirt from the description above must be worn under sweatshirts and sweater vests.
- Sweatshirts must be solid in one of the above colors with banded wrists and waist. Must have a crew (rounded) neck and may not have a hood or a pouch.
- Coats and light jackets may be worn to school, but must be placed in student's locker during school hours.

Shoes

Comfortable for walking and general exercise. Must include a back strap over the heel. Heels may not be higher than 2 inches. Shoelaces must be white, black, or brown and match.

Socks

Solid color. Must match dress code colors and both be same color.

Bottom

Khaki, navy, or black.

- Trousers or slacks in docker style.
- No overalls or skorts.
- No denim, corduroy, vinyl, leather, nylon, spandex or stretch material allowed.
- No baggy or clinging pants. Waist of pants must be within 1" of natural measured waist.
- Pants must be hemmed and may not touch the ground.
- Shorts and skirts should not be shorter than 4" from the ground when kneeling. The only acceptable colors and fabrics are listed above for trousers.
- Belt required if belt loops are present. Belt must not extend more than 6" from buckle. Belt must be visible. Acceptable colors include navy, brown, and black.
- No oversized pockets in the front or rear. No pockets on the pant leg.

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Webster Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

White, navy, maroon, or forest green.

- Must be collared shirt and have sleeves.
- No logo except Webster Intermediate School.
- No oversized shirts allowed.

Sweatshirts, sweaters, and turtlenecks will be added as weather requires. School spirit shirts and jumpers are available in the Webster Intermediate School office, (281) 332-2411. All items may be purchased at clothing and/or department stores.

Shoes

Flat and secured around heel.

Bottom

Khaki, navy, or black.

- Slacks, shorts, skirts, skorts
- No denim allowed.
- Mid-thigh or longer.
- Belt required if belt loops.
- Absolutely **No** baggy pants.

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Clear View Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

Oxford shirt in white, yellow, or blue.
Short sleeved polo-style in white, yellow, navy, light blue, or hunter green.

- Sweatshirt (no hoods) in white, navy, or hunter green. Sweater vest (worn over the oxford or polo-style shirt; button-up or pull-over) in white, yellow, navy, or hunter green. Sweaters (button up or pull-over) in white, yellow, navy, or hunter green.
- Jackets - navy or khaki (includes hoods, zippered sweatshirts).

Shirts, sweaters, sweatshirts, jackets, and accessories must be plain with no logos.

Shoes

Smooth leather loafer or tie (low cut) in dark brown. Sole must be no more than 1/4" thick, heel must be no more than 1/2" thick, and shoe laces must be dark brown.

Socks

Crew socks (mid-calf) in navy or white.

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Bottom

Slacks in navy or khaki. Web belt with plain buckle in navy or khaki.

Brookside Intermediate 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

Shirts/Blouses

White, blue-any shade, red-true,primary, gold/yellow-any shade, or black.

1. Polo/Golf Shirt - short or long sleeved, with a collar, solid in color, **No Logos**. All of the colors listed above may be worn.
 - A plain, short sleeved t-shirt in the above colors may be worn as under shirt.
 - All shirts must be tucked in where the belt loops can be seen and must be the appropriate length to stay tucked in.
 - No more than two buttons may be unbuttoned.
2. Dress shirts - short or long sleeved, with a collar, solid in color, **No Logos** (Buttons down the front)
 - All of the colors listed above may be worn
 - All shirts must be tucked in where the belt loops can be seen and must be the appropriate length to stay tucked in.
3. Spirit Shirts - should be ordered through school programs and must meet dress code guidelines.
 - Shirts or blouses should be made of cotton or cotton blends.

No Sheer Or Clinging Fabrics Allowed.

Sweaters, vests, sweatshirts, and windbreakers

- These items must be in the same colors as the shirts.
- There may not be a logo, other than a school logo.
- An approved dress code shirt must be worn under the sweatshirt, vest, sweater, or windbreaker.
- All items must be properly sized.
- Sweatshirt must be pull over, crew neck type without zippers and may not have hoods.
- These items of clothing may not be worn tied around the waist.
- Jackets and coats may not be worn in the classrooms.

Shoes & Socks

- Shoes must be comfortable for walking.
- House slippers, athletic sandals, and flip-flops are not allowed.
- Heels may not be higher than 2".
- Socks must be a solid color and meet any of the dress code colors.

Belts

- If belt loops are present, a belt must be worn.
- The belt may be in any of the approved dress code colors, or brown.

Bottom

Pants

Black, navy blue, or khaki-any shade.

- Docker style pants with pleats or flat front, standard 5 pocket pants, capri pants
- All pants must be solid in color. All of the colors listed above under pants may be worn.
- **No Denim fabric, Vinyl, Leather Or Spandex may be worn.**
- Pants must be appropriately sized in the waist and legs. They may not be oversized or excessively tight in any area. No baggy or sagging pants will be allowed.
- Pant legs may not be more than 4" wide when measured at mid-thigh.
- All pants must be hemmed or cuffed. They may not touch the floor. Flared pants may not cover the shoe.
- No pockets are allowed on the legs.
- **Black bottoms and black shirts cannot be worn on same day.**

Shorts, Skirts, Skorts, and Jumpers

- Shorts, skirts, skorts, and jumpers must be solid in color. All of the colors listed above under pants may be worn.
- A shirt in the approved dress code must be worn underneath the jumper.
- All of these items of clothing must be no shorter than 3" above the top of the knee cap.
- Short or long skirts may not have a slit above knee.
- No pockets are allowed on the sides of the skirt.
- Rules on fabric, style and fit for pants applies here, also.
- **Black bottoms and black shirts cannot be worn on same day.**

Jewelry

- Pierced jewelry is limited to ears only.
- No inappropriate jewelry will be allowed.

The principals shall determine if clothing is appropriate for school wear.

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Clear Lake City Elementary 2000-2001 Dress Code

Top

Red, white, navy, or light blue.

- Must be solid in color.
- Polo or Oxford style shirts - collared, tucked in, and no visible logos.
- Sweaters, cardigans, jackets, sweatshirts, turtlenecks, and vests are allowed in solid red, white, navy or light blue. (Excluding turtle necks, shirts with a collar must be worn under each of the above.)

Shoes

Tennis shoes are recommended for safety reasons, but not required. Tennis shoes must be mostly white with limited designs or logos. No platform tennis shoes allowed.

- All other shoes must be solid colors with closed toes and no high heels.
- No clogs or sandals allowed.

Socks

Required.

Exceptions

Organizational uniforms such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc. are allowed. Student Council members and choir members may wear their special shirts, and students receiving DARE instruction may wear their shirts. Every Friday is "Spirit Day" and students may wear a Clear Lake City Elementary School theme shirt or a solid royal blue shirt. The last Friday of the each month will be "Free Dress Day" and students may dress as they wish within the guidelines of the Clear Creek ISD dress code. Other "Special Dress Days" will be posted on the school calendar and will appear in the school newsletter.

Bottom

Navy, black, or khaki.

- Pants, walking shorts, skirts, skorts, or jumpers.
- Hem must be fingertip length or longer.
- Belt required if belt loops. Belts must be brown, black, or the color matching the shirt worn. (Not required for kindergarten and first grade students.)
- No cargo, painter, carpenter, overalls, shortalls, bike shorts, blue jeans, capri, or sweatpants.

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
